TO CONTROL FLIES AND ODORS

- Replace urine soaked bedding with fresh bedding.
- Feed horse away from watering area. Damp feed attracts flies.
- Use fly insecticides and baits. Be sure to follow directions on container carefully.

FOR PROPER DISPOSAL OF MANURE

- Remove manure daily from stables, corrals, exercise pens, and workout areas.
- Store manure in a fly-tight trash can, garbage bin, or in plastic bags.
- Stockpile and cover it with a tarpaulin. Make sure the edges are sealed and fly-tight.
- Manure placed in large fly-tight plastic bags put in a dumpster will be removed weekly by trash removal trucks.

TO CONTROL DUST

- Sprinkle water over the workout area to keep dust down.
- Special dust-controlling products, which can be found at your local tack and feed store, work very well.

FOR PROPER WATER MANAGEMENT

- Place watering trough where you have the best drainage.
- If possible, slope roof away from corrals or stalls to prevent flooding and diseases such as hoof rot and thrush.
- If this is not possible, use roof gutters to prevent runoff water from draining into corral or stall.
- Remove water hose from trough. The hose may draw water from the trough into your house supply and contaminate it.
